d. Updating Standard Park Kit Amenities

Presenter: Nicole Van Houten

Representing: City staff.

Discussion Item: **Standard Park Kit Amenities** were established in 2014/2015 when the majority of neighborhood parks were installed. A discussion was to determine if these amenities are the amenities the Board wishes to continue requiring of neighborhood parks in the future. If these are to remain the same, then we will want updated quotes for better share pricing. While the staff believes it makes sense to have certain amenities in each park, it is critical that each park has its own character and the neighborhood has input into local park development.

The Board agreed that Standard Park Kit amenities should exist in all the parks, but they should not necessarily look all alike from park to park.

Standard Park Kit:

- Open-air shelter
- Park sign
- One or more trees
- Pet station
- Hours of operation sign
- Public smoking regulations sign
- Decorative trash receptacle
- Picnic table with anti-vandalism bar and clamps
- Bike rack
- Bench
- Playground equipment

Motion by Robinson seconded by Karwoski to recommend the Standard Park Kit for City Council approval. Vote on Motion 7-0. Motion carried.

Discussion Item: The **Memorial Park Amenities** are displayed on the city [website](#). We have had two inquiries this past year about **Memorial Park Amenities** and they have chosen to do something else because of the cost associated with it. A community member is inquiring if a wood or recycling table would be allowed. The current quote for a memorial bench, including the anti-vandalism bar and surface mount. Originally, in 2013, it cost a little less than \$800, and today it costs a little less than \$2,000. The Board discussed whether or not adjustments are necessary to the current Memorial Park Amenities that are identified. Additionally, the board brainstormed ideas for other memorial options.

The Board agreed to the following amendments:

- Remove the trash receptacle from the Memorial Gift list.

Williams and Simpson are concerned about the upkeep of a wood bench or picnic table. The Standard Park Kit should set a standard for a Memorial Gift and if an alternative is to be considered, the Board can review it on an as-needed basis.

The Board brainstormed other memorial options:

- Consider a memorial board or sign at a Specialty Park or Community Park to place nameplates as a donation wall with memorial nameplates for loved ones. Possibly at Central Park, City Park, or at the Bondurant Regional Trailhead near the Chichqua Valley Trail.

Discussion Item: A current Memorial Gift request was submitted to the City for consideration. The Baker Memorial will include a bench, a tree, and a

plaque. The memorial will be placed at Lake Petocka. Based on the location they have chosen, the Bondurant Tree Board has suggested a Swamp White Oak.

Motion by Robinson seconded by Karwoski to approve the tree placement on the outer edge of the Lake Petocka Trail and the tree placement on the inside of Lake Petocka Trail. Vote on Motion 7-0. Motion carried.

e. Neighborhood Parks

Presenter: Nicole Van Houten

Representing: City staff.

Discussion Item: There are a lot of park projects that are planned for 2022/2023, including the Bondurant Dog Park, Central Park Planning, City Park Schematic Design Planning, Bondurant Skate Park, and Eagle Park. A Park Side Trail connection is also being planned, for construction in FY24. Additionally, staff has discussed the need for a trail connection along Grant Street, north of Second Street towards the high school and connecting with the existing trail. The Ditch 2 Stream Stabilization project includes a trail that will go from Second Street NW and connect with the Chichaqua Valley Trail. The staff is also collaborating with the School District on planning tennis and pickleball courts, tentatively scheduled for construction in the calendar year 2024 and in FY25.

At this time, should the board consider focusing on the current projects and take into consideration additional amenities at neighborhood parks in the future?

The Bondurant Parks Master Plan will come after the overall Comprehensive Plan is complete, which may better guide what amenities should go where. This is a time to discuss what parks amenities need to go where in terms of each park having a special feature.

Now that the men's club has attended the board

meeting a few times, including brainstorming, sorting out, and organizing park inventory. The Bondurant Men's Club asks that a Park and Recreation Board member volunteer to attend their next meeting to discuss neighborhood park amenities. The club will vote on what to fund. The Bondurant Men's Club meets on the first and third Wednesday of the month at 7 pm.

The Board considered an amenity to present to the Bondurant Men's Club. Robinson and Lyman volunteer to attend the next Men's Club meeting and propose a Memorial Wall or share a list of Standard Park Kit amenities missing from the current parks.

BRIEF HISTORY & ANALYSIS: Now that the dog park funding is secured, let's provide dog park rules and regulation recommendations to City Council. Staff research has unveiled 29 rational rules and regulations that require group discussions. Dog park rules were collected from nine dog parks, mostly within Iowa.

Chapter 47 of the Bondurant City Code outlines Park Regulations that will need to align with the dog park operations.

Attached are the nine dog parks rules and regulations examples and the initial draft of the **Bondurant Dog Park Rules and Regulations**.

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Bondurant Dog Park Rules and Regulations

No dogs with known history of aggression, fighting, or biting. Dogs showing aggression towards people or other animals will be removed from the park. Animals who exhibit a history of aggressive behavior will not be

No children under 10 years of age.

Only 2 dogs per handler. Handlers are allowed to supervise a maximum of two dogs

Zero tolerance for dog waste - handlers must pick up and dispose of their dog's waste. To decrease the spread of

Dogs in heat will not be allowed inside the park.

To maintain control, always carry a leash within the facility, one leash per dog

Dogs should be leashed before entering and prior to leaving the park. Leash must be off inside the park.

Dog handlers must be 16 years old or older

The entire Dog Park, including the parking lot, is tobacco free.

Dogs must be over four months old

Dogs can never be left unattended. Handlers should be in the actual physical presence (within eyesight) of dogs at

To protect dog paws, glass is not allowed at this site.

A flat buckle collar (with a Facility Permit Tag) and a current rabies tag is required. Pinch / prong / spike collars are

No digging, and owners are responsible and liable for any damage caused by their dogs.

Sick dogs (i.e. Kennel Cough, etc.) should not be brought to the Dog Park.

Gates must be kept closed at all times.

No animals besides dogs are permitted in the dog park.

Owners are responsible and liable for any damage caused by their dogs. Owners are responsible and liable for any

Large Dog Area - Dogs must be over 15" at shoulder and/or dogs over 20 lbs.

Small Dog Area - Dogs must be under 15" at shoulder and/or dogs under 20 lbs.

No food or beverages inside the fenced area of the dog park. Dogs may become aggressive around human food and

Violators will be subject to removal from park and suspension of park privileges.

Shoes are required.

Owners are legally responsible for their dogs and any injuries caused by them.

Use of the facility is at the owner's/handler's own risk.

Dogs must be licensed with the City or other city of residence.

Dog must display rabies tags, be current on all vaccinations, and be healthy.

The off-leash dog area is for dogs and their handlers. No other use is permitted (including skateboard, bicycles, scooters,

CHAPTER 47

47.01 PURPOSE. The purpose of this chapter is to facilitate the enjoyment of park facilities by the general public by establishing rules and regulations governing the use of park facilities.

(Code of Iowa, Sec. 364.12)

47.02 USE OF DRIVES REQUIRED. No person shall drive any car, cycle or other vehicle, or ride or lead any horse, in any portion of a park except upon the established drives or roadways

or ride or lead any horse, in any portion of a park except upon the established drives or roadways therein or such other places as may be officially designated by the City.

47.03 FIRES. No fires shall be built, except in a place provided therefore, and such fire shall be extinguished before leaving the area unless it is to be immediately used by some other party.

47.04 LITTERING. No person shall place, deposit, or throw any waste, refuse, litter or foreign substance in any area or receptacle except those provided for that purpose.

47.05 PARKS CLOSED. No person, except for patrons at Lake Petocka who are actively fishing with a current State of Iowa fishing license, shall enter or remain within any park between the hours of ten-thirty o'clock (10:30) p.m., and six o'clock (6:00) a.m., without first obtaining a written permit from the City.

(Ordinance No. 200518-215)

47.06 CAMPING. No person shall camp in any portion of a park except in portions prescribed or designated by the Council, and the City may refuse camping privileges or rescind any and all camping privileges for cause.

47.07 LAKE PETOCKA PARK REGULATIONS.

1. No alcoholic beverages to be sold on the premises except with permission from the City Council.
2. No off gravel driving.
3. Parking in designated areas only, with boat trailer parking only in the northwest corner of the park near the Pleasant Street / Junior Haines Parkway intersection.

**LAKE PETOCKA PARK
RULES AND REGULATIONS**

ALL RULES WILL BE STRICTLY ENFORCED

1. NO ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES TO BE SOLD ON THE PREMISES EXCEPT WITH PERMISSION FROM THE CITY COUNCIL.
2. NO OFF GRAVEL DRIVING.

6. ALL IOWA DNR FISHING REGULATIONS APPLY.
7. IN ADDITION TO A FISHING LICENSE, A TROUT FEE IS REQUIRED TO POSSESS TROUT.
8. NO SWIMMING OR WADING, EXCEPT WITH PERMISSION FROM THE CITY COUNCIL.
9. MOTORIZED WATERCRAFT SHALL NOT BE ALLOWED TO BE OPERATED OR USED ON LAKE PETOCKA.
10. NON-MOTORIZED WATERCRAFT MAY BE HAND LAUNCHED ONLY, AND

- OPERATED ON LAKE PETOCKA AS LONG AS SAID WATERCRAFT'S LENGTH DOES NOT EXCEED 13 FEET EXCLUDING CITY OR GOVERNMENT OWNED EQUIPMENT.
11. MOTORIZED MODEL BOATS MAY BE OPERATED ON LAKE PETOCKA; HOWEVER, ANYONE OPERATING A MOTORIZED MODEL BOAT MUST FIRST OBTAIN A PERMIT FROM THE CITY HALL. THERE SHALL BE NO CHARGE FOR SAID PERMIT.
 12. NO HUNTING.
 13. CITY PET ORDINANCE WILL BE ENFORCED IN THE PARK (PETS ON LEASH ONLY).
 14. NO OPEN FIRES, FIRE RINGS, OR BURNING BARRELS EXCEPT WITH PERMISSION FROM THE CITY COUNCIL.
 15. NO OVERNIGHT CAMPING EXCEPT WITH PERMISSION FROM THE CITY COUNCIL.
 16. NO LITTERING- PLEASE PUT TRASH IN RECEPTACLES PROVIDED.
 17. HANDICAPPED PARKING IS AVAILABLE IN THE DESIGNATED AREAS.
 18. 15 MPH SPEED LIMIT.

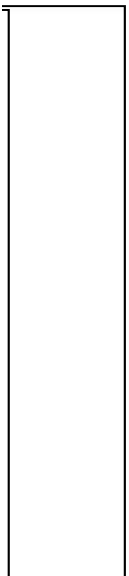
47.10 PUBLIC FISHING AREAS.

1. Public fishing areas include Lake Petocka, West Wolf Creek Pond, and North Eagle Park Pond.
2. Parking allowed in designated public parking areas only.
3. Public Fishing hours follow park hours except with special permission from the City.
4. Ice fishing is permitted at Lake Petocka only. The Iowa Department of Natural Resources recommends a minimum of four inches of clear ice for fishing. Patrons enter ice at their own risk. Any person who stands, walks, ice fishes or otherwise enters on such frozen surfaces does so at his or her own risk and is solely responsible for his or her own safety.
5. Ice skating is prohibited at all public fishing areas.
6. All Iowa Department of Natural Resources (DNR) fishing regulations apply.

7. Snowmobiles, ATVs, UTVs and other vehicles are not allowed.
8. No swimming or wading, except with special permission from the City Council.
9. Motorized watercraft shall not be allowed to be operated or used at public fishing areas.
10. Non-motorized watercraft allowed at Lake Petocka only, may be hand launched and operated.
11. No hunting. No weapons allowed.
12. No cleaning, disposing or gutting of fish is allowed on City-owned property including, but not limited to, City parks, ponds, trails, tables or shelters.
13. City pet ordinance will be enforced in all public fishing areas (pets on leash only).
14. No open fires (fire rings and burning barrels may be used with permission from the City Council).
15. No overnight camping only with special permission from the City Council.
16. Use of open waters for a private purpose is prohibited.
17. No littering.

All users are responsible for reading and following park rules.

Rules for People

All users must have a current membership to use the dog park.

Wear your membership pass card on the provided lanyard while in the park

Keep dogs on leash prior to entering and upon leaving the fenced area.

Keep gates closed at all times.

Closely supervise dogs; do not leave them alone in fenced area.

Clean up after your pet in all area of the dog park. Bags are provided.

Fill holes and stop/prevent any digging.

Carry a leash for each dog at all times; a leash should be no more than 6' in length.

Limit of 2 dogs per person are allowed.

Rules for Dogs

All dogs using the dog park must be healthy, fully immunized, and de-wormed.

Aggressive dogs MAY NOT USE the dog park.

Dogs under 4 months old are not allowed.

Small dog area size restrictions - no more than 25 lbs. and no taller than 13" at the shoulder.

General Rules

Children under 8 years of age may not enter fenced areas of the dog park.

Children under 16 must be supervised.

Tobacco and alcohol are prohibited.

Food and drink (dog or human) prohibited inside the fenced area.

Animals other than dogs are prohibited.

These rules are enforceable by police officers, animal control officers, and any other city code enforcer.

Persons may be cited or ejected for failure to follow park rules.

Lee Summit (Happy Tails Park)

1. The off-leash dog area is for dogs and their handlers. No other use is permitted (including skateboard, bicycles, scooters and rollerblades).
2. To create a positive experience for you and your dog, make sure your dog knows how to appropriately socialize with other dogs before using the park.
3. Dogs that exhibit aggressive behavior are not allowed in the park.
4. Dogs must be removed immediately from the off-leash dog area at the first sign of aggression.
5. Handlers are responsible for any injuries caused by dog(s) under their control.
6. Park users and dog owners assume all risk related to this use of the dog park. LSPR shall not be liable for any injury or damage caused by dogs or handlers in the off-leash area.
7. All animal to human bites must be reported to the City of Lee's Summit Animal Control Department immediately. City of Lee's Summit Ordinance # 5.53.
8. All users of the park shall obtain and display a CITY OF LEE'S SUMMIT dog license. Dog license and vaccination tag shall be on a collar or harness. City of Lee's Summit Ordinance # 5.82.
9. No dogs under 4 months of age are allowed.
10. All dogs visiting the park must be spayed or neutered.
11. Female dogs in heat and dogs with fresh wounds are not allowed in the Park.
12. Dogs must be under voice control of their handler and in view of their handler at all times.
13. Dogs must be on leash, a maximum length of 6 ft., when entering and exiting the off-leash dog
14. No dogs are allowed within the off-leash area while restrained by a leash.
15. Spiked collars are not allowed.
16. Children under the age of 5 are not allowed in the off-leash area.
17. Children between ages 5-8 must be accompanied by an adult.
18. Handlers must be a minimum of 16 years old.
19. Handlers must have possession of the dog leash at all times.
20. Only two dogs are allowed per handler.
21. Handlers must "scoop the poop" and dispose of waste in designated park provided container.
22. Handlers must repair all holes and damage done by their dog under their control.
23. No animals other than dogs shall be permitted in the area.
24. Park Hours of Operation 6 AM to Sunset or 9 PM whichever occurs first.

Raccoon River Dog Park

Hours of the Dog Park are 6:30 a.m. to sunset (7:00 p.m. during winter). The gates will be locked after hours. Use of the Dog Park is at the owner/handler's own risk. Permit/pass holders and their guests agree to the following rules:

Proof of permit/pass is required for all dogs inside the Dog Park. Raccoon River Park personnel will perform random checks.

No permits will be issued for puppies under 16 weeks old. All dogs in the Dog Park must be at least 16 weeks old.

Do not bring any dog with a known history of aggression, fighting, or biting. Any dog exhibiting aggressive behavior will be removed from the park.

Each handler may have only 2 dogs at any time within the Dog Park. For the protection of the natural environment, please do not feed the wildlife.

No children under 10 years of age are allowed within the Dog Park. Unfortunately, small children are at the discretion of the handler.

Handlers of dogs must be over 16 years of age. Children under 16 years of age must be supervised by an adult.

No wheeled or motorized vehicles are allowed within the Dog Park. Exceptions to this are wheelchairs and golf carts.

Except for within the Dog Park, dogs must be on leash in all areas of the West Des Moines park system.

Female dogs in heat are not allowed in the Dog Park.

All owners/handlers must clean up after their dog in all areas of the Dog Park, including tall grass areas.

Dogs shall be under visual contact and voice control of the handler at all times. You must stay within close proximity of your dog.

Permits, passes, and tags cannot be transferred to other dogs or dog owners.

Dogs in the Small Dog Area of the Dog Park can be no taller than 13" at the shoulder and weigh no more than 25 lbs.

No animal food is allowed within the Dog Park, other than small training treats.

The permit may be permanently revoked for any violation of these rules. It is important that the dog owner/handler read and understand these rules.
